Giampiero Assumma, born in Naples in 1969, is a documentary and fine-art photographer. His body of work is comprised of many long term projects that offer their own constructive interpretation of the human condition. Photos are marked with an existentialist character, and often explore borders and outer-limit experiences. Alienation, faith, addictions, and rituals are also recurring themes throughout his series. He is currently based in Moscow.

Alessandra Ballotti, is an assistant professor in Nordic studies and Scandinavian literature at Sorbonne University. A specialist in Scandinavian literature, she is currently working on coming-of-age literature, Borealism and Blue Humanities. She is the author of a book on Italian and Scandinavian modern literature *Le héros immature* (upcoming).

Edward G. Bell, studied Latin and French at St Anne's College, Oxford, before moving to Paris in 2014. Have worked as a theatre teacher since 2017 and am involved in promoting anglophone literature through Paris Lit Up. Currently preparing a Masters in Germanic and Nordic studies at the Sorbonne.

Sylvain Briens, is professor of Nordic Literature at the Sorbonne, essayist and musician. After a career as an engineer in the telecommunications industry and at the United Nations, he taught Scandinavian languages, literature and civilisation at the University of Strasbourg and then at the Sorbonne. His research mainly focuses on Scandinavian modern literature, cultural transfers, and Blue Humanities.

Fernando Clemot, escritora española de Barcelona, profesora de Filología Hispánica en la Universidad de Barcelona, autora de "En la frontera" (Los mejores cuentos de la literatura china_2008) y Siglo XXI: Los nuevos nombres del cuento español._2010. Ganador de numerosos premios, entre ellos: Premio Internacional Barcarola de Narrativa_2006 y Premio Setenil_2009; colabora con numerosas revistas literarias entre ellas: Quimera, Barcarola, Educomanía y Paralelo Sur.

Emma Dubreucq, born and raised in the south of France, at the seaside, which is an important part of her writing, she studied Scandinavian languages and literature at the Sorbonne 2012/2016. Winner of Premio Energheia Sorbona in 2017 and Special mention in 2018 in Matera with the stories *Le vent du sud* and *Il était mon père*. She lives between Paris and the southern beaches where she grew up. Writing is her way to reinvent our lives and make us become whoever we want. She has finished two novels.

Álvaro Gil-Robles, es un jurista Segovia (Spain) y activista español. Catedrático de Derecho Administrativo en la Universidad de Madrid. Fue Defensor del Pueblo (Defensor del Pueblo; 1983-1985 y 1988-1993). Fue comisionado de derechos humanos del Consejo de Europa desde el 15 de octubre de 1999 hasta el 31 de marzo de 2006. De 2000 a 2005, visitó las



oficinas de instituciones públicas en varios países revelando violaciones de derechos humanos a los respectivos gobiernos en sus informes, para su mejora futura.

Ulf Peter Hallberg, Swedish writer living in Berlin since 1983. Cosmopolitan novels: *The Flâneur's Gaze*, 1993; *Grand Tour*, 2005; *Legends & Lies* 2007, *European Trash*, 2012; *Strindberg's Shadow in the Paris of the North* 2012, *Berlin Transit* 2019. Three of his novels have been published in Italy by Iperborea, *Lo sguardo dal flâneur* 2002, *Il calcio rubato* 2006, *Trash europeo* 2013. Hallberg has translated Walter Benjamin's *The Arcades Project. Paris, Capital of the 19th Century* into Swedish in 1990; in 2016 he published two volumes with eight plays by Shakespeare. He teaches creative writing at UFR d'Études germaniques et nordiques, Paris-Sorbonne. His new novel, *The Messenger from the North*, 2023, has been bought by Gallimard, France.

Tabea Hawkins, studied German, English, Philosophy and Educational Sciences at the Ludwig Maximilian University of Munich and is now pursuing her PhD in medieval German literature. She won the Premio Energheia Germany in 2022 with her short story 'My Brother and his Music'. She continues to write as part of the writing group Untold Stories and teaches creative writing workshops at her university's writing center.

Silvana Kühtz has a multi-disciplinary background: Engineering at Politecnico di Bari (Italy), Ph.D. degree at Imperial College of Science (University of London, UK), Master Course in Communication. Senior lecturer of Listening Communication Creativity, faculty of Architecture based in Matera, Dept of European and Mediterranean Cultures. Trained to lead workshops that focus on poetry reading and writing, walking in open spaces and observing the possibilities of beauty and senses. She has created the artistic collective Poesia in Azione and the project labellezzadellacura, poetic experimentation as a form of care integrated with clinical medical practices, supports and enriches the lives of caregivers and patients.

Roberto Riviello, has studied Philosophy of Language at the University of Florence and discussed a dissertation on Ch.S. Peirce's Semiotics in 1978. Afterwards he has always been teaching Italian Literature and History in high schools of Tuscany. He has also taught film script writing and directed drama workshops. He has written and directed radio plays for RAI and several theatrical plays. His movie "Il più lungo giorno" has won the Prix du public in the Annecy Film Festival (1999). In 2014 his short novel "Dialogo antroposofico al mare" was published in Energheia's anthology "Futuro remoto". He currently works with various websites, writing about Italian culture and art.

Frédérique Toudoire-Surlapierre, is a professor of Scandinavian literature at Sorbonne University. She is a specialist in Scandinavian literature (*L'imaginaire nordique*, *Hamlet l'ombre et la mémoire*, *Le corps chez Munch et Bacon*) and is currently working on Nordic



Noir, Borealism and Blue Humanities. She is also the author of several essays that have appeared in the collection « Paradoxe » for *Minuit: Oui / Non* (2013), *Colorado* (2015), *Téléphonez-moi. La revanche d'Écho* (2016), *Le fait divers et ses fictions* (2019).
